Victorian Auditor-General's Office – Proposed Report – Integrated Transport Planning

Thank you for your letter of 9 July 2021 relating to the 'Integrated Transport Planning' performance audit and for the opportunity to provide comments on the proposed report (the Report).

The Department of Transport (DoT) does not agree with all the conclusions and findings in the Report. The Department has an integrated transport planning approach and is meeting the requirements of the *Transport Integration Act 2010*.

The Department is therefore meeting both stated lines of inquiry for this audit and believes it has demonstrated this through the information it has provided to your office with comprehensive supporting evidence.

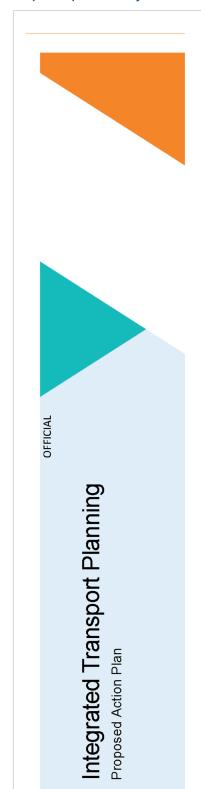
Bringing together VicRoads, PTV and Development Victoria with the Department of Transport, which includes the Major Transport Infrastructure Authority (MTIA), means for the first time Victoria has one central agency designing, planning and delivering an integrated transport system for all Victorians

The Department is on a program of continuous improvement and development. We continue to improve work practices, provide greater role clarity and invest more effort in our priorities. In recognising the need to continue to strengthen integrated transport planning practice, organisational coordination and transparency to the Victorian community, DoT has already implemented a number of actions to further enhance integrated transport planning outcomes. Examples of these actions include:

- Government endorsement, adoption and DOT website refresh to present Victorian Transport Strategic Directions and publish work progressed under each of these;
- DoT's Strategic Plan 2020-2023 (fully aligned with the Transport Strategic Directions and focus areas for internal delivery against these);
