Thank you for your letter dated 17 October 2023, inviting the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF) to respond to the limited assurance review: Major Projects Performance Reporting 2023.

DTF notes the conclusions of the review and the two recommendations directed at DTF including the Office of Projects Victoria (OPV). DTF accepts in principle the recommendations and I have attached an action plan to this letter to address your recommendations.

Thank you for your letter enclosing the provisional draft report on Major Projects Performance Reporting 2023 and for allowing the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing (the department) the opportunity to provide further submissions or comments.

The department supports Victorian Auditor-General's Office (VAGO's) recommendation in ensuring that the Budget Paper 4: State Capital Program footnotes are clear and informative to provide transparency of changes for readers of the Budget Papers.

The department acknowledges VAGO's representation to the Department of Treasury and Finance with regards to including commentary on historical changes and context which is now captured in Recommendation 2. This change will support agencies providing key contextual information to the footnotes. As previously raised, the 'Carlton redevelopment – 246 units/sites' project is shown with a 20-quarter variance, however the social housing outcomes were achieved in 2014 and the project will not be formally finalised until the balance of the private apartments are sold. The extended duration has allowed for increased financial outcomes to the State (without an increase in Total Expected Investment).

Proposed Report - Major Projects Performance Reporting - 2023

Thank you for providing my department with the opportunity to provide a submission to your report, Major Projects Performance Reporting – 2023.

My department is committed to providing value for money for the Victorian community in respect to the significant investments government has made in health infrastructure. It is also committed to accurate and transparent reporting of progress of capital projects and the rationale behind any changes to budget, completion date and scope in pursuing this objective. VAGO's advice as to how this might be improved is accepted.

In VAGO's acquittal of issues raised by the Department of Health on the provisional report, the BP4 2023-24 footnote has been used to explain the Ballarat Base Hospital redevelopment completion date change. However, that footnote relates to a subsequent unrelated Total Estimated Investment (TEI) change due to additional scope. The relevant BP4 2022-23 footnote explains this change is different. I acknowledge that you have included a column in Figure 6, reasons for variance, to highlight context that agencies provided in their survey response or in our report last year.

For the projects raised in Chapter 2 of the report, I am pleased to offer the following further information on the TEI and completion date changes:

Building a world class hospital for Frankston families

The TEI change reflects an amended procurement strategy (moving from a traditional procurement model to a public private partnership). The TEI includes 25 years of operational and lifecycle costs alongside the capital costs and remains within its original approved affordability benchmark. There is no additional cost to the taxpayer over the whole project term.

Additional acute mental health beds in regional Victoria

The estimated completion date was revised to align with efforts across the portfolio to maximise market capacity.

Ballarat Health Services expansion and redevelopment

The completion date was extended due to include the new central energy plant in scope, which required an amended sequence of works, and the inclusion of a 12-month defects and liabilities period.

Goulburn Valley Hospital - planning and development

The completion date was revised to account for the inclusion of refurbishment and compliance works due to additional scope to include 24-hour emergency imaging services, a radiology facility and a new operating theatre. Additionally, resequencing of works was required to maintain capacity and clinical segregation to respond to COVID-19.
