Thank you for your letter of 28 May 2025 enclosing the *Developing Fishermans Bend* performance audit proposed report (the Report) and inviting the Department of Transport and Planning (the Department) to provide its response.

The Report examines delivery progress in relation to the 2018 *Fishermans Bend Framework* (the Framework). At the outset, it is important to note that much has changed since the document was released. We have experienced a pandemic, new terms of Government, multiple machinery of Government changes and the emergence of significant new Government policy, including the release of Victoria's Housing Statement in 2023, that bear directly upon the delivery of the Framework.

I acknowledge the Report's recommendations in relation to aspects of the 2018 Framework and attach an action plan in response, which accepts in principle all of the recommendations.

The Department's action plan will formally document for Government approval the outcomes of the continual adjustment to priorities and timelines that has occurred since the Framework was released.

In the seven years since the Framework was approved, there has been significant private and government investment in Fishermans Bend. Outcomes are occurring on the ground, and development is comfortably on track to achieve the vision for 80,000 residents and 80,000 jobs by 2055.
